CCTC Workshop Registration Policy

Please send us a separate check for each workshop. If one workshop that you selected is cancelled due to low enrollment, we will simply return your check to you. Otherwise, you will have to wait until our Business Office processes refunds.

Once the Center has received your completed workshop registration form and check for each workshop, the process is as follows:

You are put on a registration list for each workshop you have indicated that you wish to attend. While our funding is for teacher training, we do let support staff, school board members, student teachers and community members take our workshops on a space available basis. Teachers, however, will be given priority.

Participants are listed in chronological order based upon receipt of **registration information and fee**. Thus it is a first-come, first-served basis. The fee is non-refundable unless a course is cancelled or you withdraw two weeks prior to the workshop. If you are unable to attend, you may send a replacement.

If you were sent a rejection notice for a workshop last year, you will be given preference if you register for this workshop in the **next** workshop cycle.

On the registration deadline, June 6th, the Center determines whether there is sufficient enrollment to hold that particular workshop. If there is, a participant list is sent to the presenter. If there is insufficient registration, the workshop will be cancelled. You will receive notification from the Center and we will return your voided check.

Once you have been accepted into a workshop, our office will send you a confirmation memo. If a workshop was already filled prior to the Center receiving your registration form and the appropriate fee, you will receive a rejection notice; and we will return your check for that workshop. After the workshop cycle, we make a list of teachers who were rejected in order to give them priority for that particular workshop the next time it is offered.

Please be advised that previously rejected registrants will not automatically be registered for current workshops. You must register for the current offering.

You may send your registration form and checks for the appropriate fees through either the US Mail or via BOCES mail. Please keep in mind that BOCES mail takes 2-3 days **longer**. **Checks should be made payable to Chautauqua County Teachers' Center. Please do not send cash.**

Refunds

The Center's policy regarding workshop registration fees states that the fee is **non-refundable** unless a course is cancelled or the participant withdraws two weeks prior to the workshop. If the workshop is cancelled on the Registration Deadline due to low enrollment, your check for that workshop will be returned to you.
