## Workshop Registration Policy

While our funding is for teacher training, we do allow other educational stakeholders to participate in our workshops on a space available basis after our primary audience has registered. Any student teacher who expresses interest in attending a Chautauqua County Teachers' Center workshop will be able to attend with his/her cooperating teacher as long as the registrations are received by the registration deadline. On the registration deadline, the Center determines whether there is sufficient enrollment to hold that particular workshop. If there is, a participant list is sent to the presenter and a confirmation memo will be mailed to each registrant. If there is insufficient registration, the workshop will be cancelled and a cancellation memo will be sent to each registrant.
